SNOW REMOVAL PRIORITY POLICY

Snow removal begins when:

- Snow accumulation reaches 7–10 cm (3–4 inches)
- Drifting causes blocked roads

PRIORITY 1 – RESIDENTIAL STREETS

- All residential streets.
- Bus Stops

Goal: Clear within 12 hours after snowfall ends, conditions permitting.

PRIORITY 2 – MUNICIPAL FACILITIES & PARKING AREAS

- Village office lot
- Community Centre/Rink lots
- Village Shop
- Additional areas as required

Goal: Clear within 24–48 hours after snowfall ends.

PRIORITY 3 – SIDEWALKS

The Village clears municipal sidewalks only. Residents remain responsible for adjacent sidewalks.

WINDROWS & DRIVEWAY CLEARING

Windrows are unavoidable. The Village does not clear private driveways. Residents are responsible to clear windrows.

Reminder: please keep vehicles off the roadways for snow removal
